

Biosolids Dewatering Polymer (Re-bid) SUBJECT:

Request for Bid Specification No. ES19-0432F

Pursuant to the City of Tacoma March 12, 2020, state of emergency proclamation in response to COVID-19, made in accordance with Tacoma Municipal Code Chapter 1.10., contract awards for purchases must be approved by the City Manager or designee.

RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:

The Environmental Services Department recommends a contract be awarded to Marubeni Specialty Chemicals Inc., White Plains, NY, in the amount of \$604,608.00, sales tax not applicable, budgeted from the ES Wastewater Fund 4300, for an initial two-year term with the option to renew for three additional one-year terms, for a projected contract total of \$1,511,520.00, for biosolids dewatering polymer used at the Central Wastewater Treatment Plant.

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

- Strengthen and support a safe city with healthy residents.
- Assure outstanding stewardship of the natural and built environment.

Dewatering polymer removes moisture from wastewater solids creating raw material of the nutrient rich, organic soil amendment TAGRO product and provides the cleanest residual water remaining from the wastewater treatment process.

BACKGROUND:

ISSUE: Biosolids dewatering polymer produces the best dewatered solids and the cleanest residual water remaining from the treatment process. Dewatered biosolid is used as a raw material in the City of Tacoma TAGRO soil amendment product.

ALTERNATIVES: The alternative to not approving this contract would cause a re-bid of the same required product to meet the purchase and warranty agreements of the new biosolids dewatering system located at the Central Treatment Plant. Without the use of dewatering polymer the City could not remove moisture from wastewater solids used in the creation of TAGRO products.



COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION: Request for Bid Specification No. ES19-0432F was opened February 4, 2020. Five companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Three submittals were received. The low bidder, Marubeni Specialty Chemicals Inc., is recommended for award.

The recommended award is 54 percent below the pre-bid estimate.

CONTRACT HISTORY: New contract.

SUSTAINABILITY: The use of dewatering polymer is a key ingredient in the recycling of wastewater solids into raw material used in creation of the nutrient rich, soil amendment TAGRO with the resulting removed water being retreated and returned to Commencement Bay.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Environmental Services Department recommends a contract be awarded to Marubeni Specialty Chemicals Inc., White Plains, NY, in the amount of \$604,608.00, sales tax not applicable, budgeted from the ES Wastewater Fund 4300, for an initial two-year term with the option to renew for three additional one-year terms, for a projected contract total of \$1,511,520.00, for biosolids dewatering polymer used at the Central Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Request for Bids, Specification No. PW19-0387F

DATE: May 28, 2020

Pursuant to the City of Tacoma March 12, 2020, state of emergency proclamation in response to COVID-19, made in accordance with Tacoma Municipal Code Chapter 1.10., contract awards for purchases must be approved by the City Manager or designee.

RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:

The Public Works Department recommends a contract be awarded to Razz Construction Inc, Bellingham, WA, in the amount of \$1,548,185.35, plus a 20 percent contingency, for a cumulative total of \$1,857,822.42, plus applicable taxes, budgeted from the 1060 Transportation Capital Fund, for bridge deck maintenance and repairs, ADA improvements and roadway adjustments and restriping to accommodate new bicycle lanes.

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

- Strengthen and support a safe city with healthy residents.
- Foster a vibrant and diverse economy with good jobs for all Tacoma residents.
- Cultivate a vibrant cultural sector that fosters a creative, cohesive community.
- Assure outstanding stewardship of the natural and built environment.

The proposed project will provide necessary bridge upgrades to extend the life span of the bridge and improve travel safety. The project will install ADA, pedestrian and bike improvements promoting active transportation alternatives.

BACKGROUND:

The Yakima Avenue bridge deck is cement concrete and is in need of repairs. Funding to repair the bridge deck was acquired from a 2017 Local Bridge Program federal grant for \$2,990,000.00. The grant also included ADA improvements as necessary. The grant was accepted by the City Council in Resolution No. 39924, adopted January 30, 2018. During the design of the repairs and improvements, the opportunity to install bike lanes as a part of restriping the bridge was identified. Bike lanes across the bridge are included within the City's Transportation Master Plan.

The City received construction authorization from Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) on March 3, 2020.

ISSUE: The existing Yakima Avenue bridge deck surface is spalled and delaminated, and all expansion joints have failed. This project will provide a new cement concrete overlay on the bridge deck, expansion joints and minor bridge repairs. ADA improvements will also be provided.



Other work activities funded by the City will include those necessary to re-channelize the bridge and areas north and south of the bridge for bike lane accommodations in accordance with the City's Transportation Master Plan.

ALTERNATIVES: Alternatives to completing this project would be to wait and provide the needed maintenance at later time pending availability of funds, provide temporary measures to maintain the bridge or do not move forward with the repairs and improvements. Likely repercussions of the alternatives include loss of funding, a missed opportunity to install bike lanes across the bridge, and in the longer term potential bridge closure due to lack of maintenance. The alternatives would not support the City's strategic policy goals of supporting the economy, its residents/communities and operating in an efficient and effective manner.

COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION:

Request for Bids Specification No. PW19-0387F was opened April 21, 2020. No companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Nine submittals were received.

Razz Construction Inc submitted a bid that resulted in the lowest evaluated submittal after consideration of Underutilized Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (UDBE) participation goals and requirements. MJ Hughes Construction Inc, Quigg Bros Inc and Global Contractors LLC were deemed non-responsive due to failing to submit an original bid bond.* Westwater Construction Co and Conway Construction Co were deemed non-responsive due to failing to submit an original bid bond and for failing to submit the required UDBE Written Confirmation Document within 48 hours of bid opening.**

SUSTAINABILITY: The project will improve the City's bridge infrastructure and safety of residents by providing a new driving surface for motorized and non-motorized travel.

Bike lanes and ADA curb ramps will also be installed as part of the contract addressing social equity factors including mobility, as well as ergonomic and human health impacts.

UNDERUTILIZED DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE: The recommended contract is in compliance with 49 Code of Federal Regulations Part 26, per WSDOT concurrence dated May 4, 2020. The UDBE goal for this project is 6 percent, and the UDBE participation is 6.5 percent. There are no designated training hours for this project.
