1	BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS
2	A RESOLUTION requesting the Citizen Police Advisory Committee to review the
3 4	Tacoma Police Department draft body worn cameras policy; outline an engagement process for public review and comment; and provide advisory recommendations to the City Manager.
5	WHEREAS, on February 20, 2007, at the recommendation of the City's
6	Human Rights Commission and pursuant to Ordinance No. 27589, the City Council
7 8	adopted Tacoma Municipal Code ("TMC") 1.06.075.B.1, creating and clarifying the
9	role of a Citizen Review Panel, which is currently known as the Citizen Police
10	Advisory Committee ("CPAC"), and
11	WHEREAS CPAC is a policy-focused board whose role is to ensure
12	transparency and accountability in the way that the City of Tacoma Police
13 14	Department ("TPD") operates, and
14	WHEREAS CPAC's duties and responsibilities include reviewing police
16	policy at the request of the City Council or City Manager, and providing community
17	outreach and education through public hearings and committee efforts, and
18 19	WHEREAS high-profile cases in Tacoma and across the nation have raised
20	questions regarding the impacts of implicit bias and systemic racism in policing,
21	and lead to calls for increased transparency and communications from law
22	enforcement agencies and the government bodies that oversee them, and
23	WHEREAS the Equity and Empowerment framework, adopted by the City
24	Council in 2014, makes equity a consistent guiding principle across the entire

organization and calls out specific goals to guide operational and policy decisions, 1 including a commitment to equity in policy-making, and 2 WHEREAS, in 2015, Project PEACE was generated in response to 3 community concerns about nationwide police-related conflicts to build trust, 4 relationships, and understanding between community members and law 5 6 enforcement officers in the Tacoma area, and 7 WHEREAS, through the work of Project Peace, more than 800 community 8 members, police officers, and City staff took part in six community-wide 9 conversations, resulting in a 2016 report which identified recommendations under 10 11 categories, including implementation of body worn cameras, and 11 12 WHEREAS RCW 42.56.240(14)-.240(160), related to body worn cameras 13 and personal privacy, was passed by the Washington State Legislature in 2016 14 and amended 2019, and TPD tested multiple brands of body worn cameras on a 15 number of criteria the same year, and 16 WHEREAS worldwide demonstrations on systemic racism and brutality in 17 18 policing renewed after the May 25, 2020, killing of George Floyd, a 46-year old 19 Black man, in Minneapolis Minnesota Police custody, and 20 WHEREAS, at the June 2, 2020, City Council meeting, Mayor Woodards 21 and members of the City Council expressed renewed desire for implementation of 22 body worn cameras, and 23 24 WHEREAS Manuel Ellis, a resident of Tacoma and an African-American 25 man, died in Tacoma Police custody on March 3, 2020, and on June 3, 2020, the 26 Tacoma News Tribune published Pierce County Medical Examiner findings ruling -2-

	Mr. Ellis' death a homicide, indicating that Mr. Ellis died from a lack of oxygen due
1	to physical restraint, raising further demands for body worn cameras, and
2	WHEREAS the City is committed to both long-term comprehensive reform
3 4	of systems shaped by systemic racism, including City policing, as well as
4 5	identifying and taking action on reforms that can be implemented more rapidly;
6	Now, Therefore,
7	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
8	That the City Council hereby requests the Citizen Police Advisory
9	Committee to review the Tacoma Police Department draft body worn cameras
10	policy; outline an engagement process for public review and comment; and provide
11 12	advisory recommendations to the City Manager.
