Established Transportation Benefit District (TBD)

November 27, 2012

Authorized \$20 Vehicle Fee

November 3, 2015

Proposition A - Authorized 0.1% increase in sales tax





November 3, 2019

I-976 repealed City's Authority to Collect \$20 Vehicle Fee

October 15, 2020

I-976 ruled unconstitutional by Washington State Supreme Court



SUES



Spending Plan Criteria

- Requirements of RCW 36.73.020
 - Identified in state, county, or city plan
 - Other considerations improve safety, travel time, air quality, nonmotorized connections & accessibility, and reduce facility failure
- Requirements of TMC 10.28
 - Consistent with City's Comprehensive Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, and Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program
