The City of Tacoma Emergency Management (EM) has partnered with a reputable industry leader, QuickSeries[©], on the development and implementation of a publicly accessible mobile application. This app, "Tacoma Prepared", will help the Emergency Management Program better inform the public and employees about the topic of disaster preparedness. As required under Chapter 38.52 RCW and Title 118-30 WAC, the Emergency Management Program must maintain a public education program component; this mobile app supports the implementation of that component.

The Tacoma Prepared (UNITE by QuickSeries[©]) mobile app is an emergency management tool that serves to unite community members and promote collaborative preparedness all year round. The app delivers accurate information and resources during an emergency and can be used to enhance preparation, communicate news and motivate action. With Tacoma Prepared, Emergency Management can:

- Provide trusted content that promotes personal wellness.
- Map out hazard zones, routes to safety, and locations of essential services.
- Assist individuals and families with preparing personalized emergency plans, checklists, and assessments.
- Inform users through public education-driven videos.
- Allow for the creation of private groups.
 - o Used for Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) member management.
 - o Replaced the need for additional public website and associated costs.
- Further customize access with module access codes.
 - Used for internal employee communications via all staff email-provided code.
 - o Can be used to support internal communications, alerts, exercises, etc.

The Tacoma Prepared app combines content and technology to help our residents live healthier, safer lives every day – not just in an emergency. Emergency Management operates the administrative portal, which lets us manage the app from any browser; changes in the portal appear in the app instantly, and app users can be notified in real-time as content is published. Most of this content can be downloaded directly to the mobile device and used at any point, without service connection, which will be particularly beneficial during emergency situations – such as an earthquake.
