"ISSUES



- Create relationships with Project PEACE, the Core Coordinating Team, and the National Network for Safe Communities to align current future public safety initiatives.
- Review current complaint process and make recommendations that ease access for the community, and better publicize the role of CPAC and its place as a community resource.
- Review the Tacoma Police Use of Force Policies, draft recommended changes, get community feedback, and submit final recommendations to CVS for policy development.
- Review CPAC bylaws and update to align with Tacoma Municipal Code and better reflect the operations of the current CPAC.

SUES



- Monitor the Body Worn Cameras program and ensure the community's voice and recommendations are being addressed in the union contract negotiations.
- Monitor the Community Trauma Response Team contract and ensure the vendor is meeting the needs of the community and successfully implementing the program.
- Review oversight models in Washington and nationally, draft a recommended model for Tacoma, get community feedback, and submit final recommended model to CVS for policy development.
