Dear Mayor and Council Members:

ITEMS OF INTEREST

1. <u>Adopt-A-Spot Program:</u> This program helps businesses and residents address litter and keep public spaces clean. **Adopters are provided gloves and high visibility vests, trash bags, hazardous waste collection materials, and refuse disposal**. In the past 30 days, the City has received seven new Adopt-A-Spot requests from community members interested in participating in the program. These requests represent new community groups working to adopt locations in Council Districts 1, 2, 4 and 5.

2. Warming Center Updates:

- <u>Eastside Community Center</u>: The temporary warming center at the Eastside Community Center continues to operate at capacity with 55 individuals staying overnight each night, with an additional average of 21 individuals accessing daytime services. During the inclement weather, the warming center expended to accommodate 65 individuals overnight and was at capacity every evening from 2/12-2/15. Staff continues to work to connect individuals to services. This location will operate until February 28, 2021.
- <u>The Center at Norpoint</u>: The Center at Norpoint opened as a temporary warming center on Tuesday, January 26th. The site has a capacity of 25 individuals, serving adult women and couples. An average of 20 individuals have been staying at this location each night over the last week. Site staff continues to work with shelter providers and community partners to increase referrals to the site. This location will operate until February 28, 2021.
- Salvation Army: The Salvation Army building at 1110 S. Puget Sound opened as a temporary warming shelter on Thursday, January 28th. This location serves men and has a capacity of 35 individuals and has averaged 19 individuals each evening in the past week. The location will operate through March 31, 2021.
- Senior Meal Delivery: Access to healthy meals is important to our senior population and the City has adjusted contracted services during the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure seniors can still access food while senior centers are not operating. The City's contracted partner ensured pickup and delivery of 309 meals for the week of 2/8 – 2/12/21.

STUDY SESSION/WORK SESSION

5. The City Council Study Session of Tuesday, February 23, 2021, will be conducted through Zoom conference. The public can watch the meeting at: tvtacoma.com. Discussion items will include: (1) Affordable Housing Strategy Update; (2) House Bill 1590 & RCW 82.14.530; (3) Homelessness Update; (4) Systems Transformation; (5) Other items of Interest; (6) Committee Reports; (7) Agenda Review and City Manager's Weekly Report; (8) Executive Session- Pending and Potential Litigation.

On our first agenda item, staff will provide an update on the progress of the Affordable Housing Action Strategy and seek guidance on upcoming potential actions including updates to the Rental Housing Code, changes to the Comprehensive Plan to allow and encourage "missing middle" housing, and new potential revenue sources for affordable housing (including permanent support services).

On our second agenda item, Community and Economic Development staff will be discussing a consideration of a 1/10th of 1% sales tax to provide stable annual funding for affordable housing and supportive services.

On the third agenda item, Neighborhood and Community Services staff will be giving an update on the City's approach to homelessness and will also include a discussion of recent emergency sheltering efforts.

On the last agenda item, City Manager Elizabeth Pauli will be giving an **update on Systems Transformation**.
