1 BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS, AND COUNCIL MEMBERS McCARTHY, THOMS, AND USHKA 2 A RESOLUTION relating to Equity and Empowerment; renaming Fireman's Park. 3 located at 801 "A" Street, to Firefighters' Park, to align the name of this public park with the goals of the guiding City principles of equity, diversity, 4 and inclusion, while continuing to recognize the history and contributions of 5 Tacoma's Fire Department. 6 WHEREAS in 2014, the City Council adopted an Equity and Empowerment 7 framework which made equity a guiding principle across the organization and 8 committed the City to changing practices which created or sustained inequities, 9 and 10 11 WHEREAS on August 20, 2019, the City Council adopted Resolution 12 No. 40408 amending the City's policy on place names and name changes, with a 13 primary recommendation for updating this policy to align with guiding City 14 principles, and including the concepts of equity, diversity, and inclusion when 15 considering place names and name changes throughout the City; this policy 16 17 amendment also provided the Mayor and City Council with the authority to make 18 naming proposals, and 19 WHEREAS the Tacoma Fire Department ("TFD") has been working to meet 20 the organization-wide goal of having employees who reflect the diversity of the 21 City, and part of this work has included efforts to increase representation of women 22 23 in the TFD workforce, and 24 WHEREAS this renaming request seeks to acknowledge this work and align 25 the name of this public park with the goals of the guiding City principles of equity, 26 -1-



1 diversity, and inclusion, while continuing to recognize the history and many 2 contributions of the TFD, and 3 WHEREAS in addition to efforts to recruit a more racially diverse staff, 4 targeted outreach to women is now a standard recruiting practice, and TFD has 5 partnered with the Human Resources Department ("HR") on efforts like the 2019 6 7 "Women's Firefighter Workshop," and 8 WHEREAS in 2020, HR created virtual sessions due to the COVID-19 9 pandemic, and 80 women attended, and 10 WHEREAS efforts like these have resulted in 54 out of the 404 uniformed 11 staff being women (13.4 percent) who are currently employed by TFD; the current 12 13 average across the nation is closer to 5 percent, and 14 WHEREAS, additionally nine of these women are Firefighter-Paramedics, 15 with seven serving in supervisory/leadership roles, including an Assistant Chief, 16 and one who was elected to serve as the first female President of the Firefighter's 17 union, and 18 19 WHEREAS in 2019, in acknowledgment that a firefighting career is not for 20 men alone, TFD Lieutenant Marja Stowell took the initiative to request the 21 renaming of Fireman's Park to Firefighters' Park, in keeping with the City's value of 22 equity, and an online petition was circulated in May of 2019 as part of that effort, 23 and 24 25 26 -2-



1	WHEREAS in response to Lt. Stowell's request and in alignment with		
2	Resolution No. 40408, Mayor Woodards announced an intent to bring forward a		
3	proposal to rename the park in March 2020 during that year's State of the City		
4 5	Address, however the renaming proposal was delayed due to COVID-19-related		
6	restrictions on the legislation that could be brought forward in newly virtual public		
7	meetings, as well as the need to pivot attention to emergency response efforts,		
8	and		
9	WHEREAS in addition to last year's public announcement and as part of her		
10	outreach efforts, Mayor Woodards sought the support of Downtown Tacoma		
11	Partnership and Tacoma Professional Firefighters IAFF Local 31, and at the		
12 13			
14	Mayor's request, staff provided notice to the City of Tacoma's Landmarks		
15	Preservation Commission on April 22, 2021, prior to City Council discussion of this		
16	item in Study Session, and		
17	WHEREAS this year, Mayor Woodards proposes that a resolution renaming		
18	the park be considered on International Firefighters' Day on May 4, 2021; Now,
