## **SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:**

A resolution designating two Environmental Services' projects as special projects of limited duration and designating general salary classification and benefits for persons employed on said projects pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code sections 1.12.155, 1.24.187, 1.24.980 through 1.24.986, 1.30.300, and Section 6.1(h) of the Tacoma City Charter.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

<u>This Department's Recommendation is Based On:</u> This resolution will identify and designate the projects listed below as special projects of limited duration and allow the Environmental Services Department (ES) to acquire project staff to supplement permanent staffing levels on an as-needed basis to support the following projects:

- Cleaning and CCTV of the collection systems
- Update and maintain mechanical and electrical drawings for ES facilities

Project staff may include, but not be limited to: Sewer Worker, Sewer Equipment Operator, Senior Sewer Worker, and Electrical & Instrument Technician. Project staff would receive all appropriate employee benefits.

## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:**

This resolution will allow ES to provide resources to assist, engage, and outreach with the community on cleaning and CCTV of the collection systems and update/maintain mechanical and electrical drawings for ES facilities.

#### **EVALUATION AND FOLLOW UP:**

Sanitary and surface cleaning and Close Circuit TV footage totals are tracked monthly and yearly through Transmission and Asset Management KPIs. These are compared to monthly and yearly goals set by the Asset Management and Transmission teams. ES has a detailed list of electrical drawings that need to be completed for the Central Treatment Plant, Pump Stations and North End Treatment plant. Progress in completion of these drawings is being tracked by the Asset Management and Change Management teams.

ES recommends approval of the designation of two projects as special projects of limited duration. This provides for cost and schedule efficiencies by increasing staffing levels where required and as needed during completion of work.

# 2021 ESD Special Projects of Limited Duration.

## **Summary and Purpose**

A resolution relating to special projects; designating two Environmental Services projects as special projects of limited duration.

## **Background**

This resolution will identify and designate the projects listed below as special projects of limited duration and allow the Environmental Services Department to acquire project staff to supplement permanent staffing levels on an as needed basis to support:

Cleaning and CCTV of the collection systems: The Environmental Services Department's Asset Management Program requires an expedited data collection schedule of its 100,000 infrastructure assets to meet the needs of the growing utilities and additionally, to the new emerging requirements of the City's expanded roadway program. The data collection, collation and analysis involves a mix of field work to discover, inspect and verify the asset register and then subsequent office work to manage the data. This work helps achieve the primary goal of the asset management program to ensure that the life-cycle cost of owning and operating our infrastructure assets is minimized while we continue to deliver the level of service that the City's customers require of its utilities.

Total estimated cost: \$1,500,000

# **Update and maintain mechanical and electrical drawings for Environmental Services**

This project will update and integrate multiple sources of data, drawings and other documentation associated with wastewater and surface water facilities. This project will ensure that record drawings, documentation, and other sources of data reflect current conditions and that the documentation is in compliance with NPDES permit requirements. Work will include both fieldwork and office work related to the collection of data on current assets, updating of attribute data, creation of necessary drawings/documentation, and the development of databases and integration tools to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of staff utilizing the information.
