Prevent FATAL AND SEVERE CRASHES



## **Speed Reduction**

- RCW allows 20 MPH speed limits on residential streets and nonarterial highways located in business districts with no engineering study
- Arterial streets need an engineering study
- Tacoma has 15 NBD
