Building Code Updates

[Chris Seaman, Principal Engineer, Planning and Development Services]

At approximately 4:35 p.m., Chris Seaman, Principal Engineer, Planning and Development Services, presented the building code update, including an overview and background.

Seaman continued by presenting updates; code change highlights; the health, equity, and sustainability analysis; outreach; next steps; and recommendations.

Discussion ensued regarding electric vehicle charging infrastructure, bathroom code requirements, enforcement authority and revenue generation, upcoming residential code changes, vesting codes, the energy code update, political sign code, fire sprinkler retrofits and possible impacts, the energy code, potential impacts to homeowners versus developers, and where the codes are available to read.

At approximately 5:03 p.m., Jennifer Kammerzell, Assistant Division Manager, Public Works, presented the Six-Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) annual amendments, including an overview; background; issues, noting projects removed and added; grant opportunities; the Prairie Line Trail project; the South 25th Street Traffic Safety Enhancement project; the health, equity, and sustainability analysis; and next steps.

Discussion ensued regarding the timeline of the TIP, funding sources for projects and connection with Vision Zero, projects by Council District, projects outside of the scope of the TIP, the process to add a project to the TIP, partner agencies providing feedback, the Neighborhood Planning Program and subarea plans, and grant matching,


