COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee

Council Member Mello, Chair of the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, reported on February 14, 2018, the Committee held interviews and recommended Ryan Givens to the "Architecture, Historic Preservation, and/or Urban Design" position for the Planning Commission and was appointed by the City Council, and is still seeking applicants to fill vacancies on the Commission. The Committee also received an informational briefing on cellular attachments to City poles in the right-of-way and a presentation on code and process improvements from Planning and Development Services (PDS). He then reported on February 28, 2018, Sound Transit (ST) gave a presentation on the ST3 Project and PDS provided an update on the Tacoma Mall Neighborhood Subarea Plan and the 2019-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. He stated the March 14, 2018 meeting has been cancelled. He concluded by stating the next meeting will be held on March 28, 2018, and will include an introduction to the green planning tool, Nature's Scorecard, follow-up on the 2019-2024 Transportation Improvement Program, and information on the commercial carry service charge proposal from Environmental Services.

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Deputy Mayor Ibsen stated, as part of the Metro Parks improvements, a traffic roundabout will replace the five-way intersection near the entrance to the Point Defiance Park starting now and expected to conclude in June, and a traffic detour has been introduced, guiding the traffic to enter the park through Pearl Street and exit the park via Mildred Street of the ferry traffic lanes. He noted ferry traffic will not be affected.

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Council Member Hunter congratulated Council Member Blocker, his wife, and their son for welcoming their newborn to their family.

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Mayor Woodards stated the City Council study session and business meeting for Tuesday, March 13, 2018, have been cancelled, and the next regular meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 20, 2018.
