2. <u>19-0111</u> Pierce County Workforce Development Strategic Direction and Alignment Opportunity [Linda Nguyen, CEO, Workforce Central]

> At approximately 10:06 a.m., Linda Nguyen, CEO, WorkForce Central (WFC), introduced Josh Stovall, Research and Data Analyst, WFC, and Tamar Jackson, Director of Community Engagement, WFC. She provided an update on WFC, including background, the Executive Board and the Pierce County WorkForce Development Council (WDC)

leadership, and the role of WDC and chief local elected officials. She described the 2019-2020 Regional Workforce Development Strategic Plan, including the strategic focus on two bold goals and four strategic objectives. Mr. Stovall provided the data and analysis for the first phase of the bold goals, including priority communities. Mr. Jackson presented the importance of community engagement and City of Tacoma and Tacoma Public Utilities investment in workforce development. Ms. Nguyen described the WDC investments and recommendations for both short-term and long-term opportunities to align. Ms. Nguyen concluded by providing a demonstration of the WFC job seeking website.

Discussion ensued regarding how the website benefits the community and how it is being developed, development of community services, addressing homelessness, community engagement, development of mentorship and youth growth opportunities, and better alignment between the City and WFC investments.

3. <u>19-0112</u> Foss Waterway Development Authority Land Transactions [Pat Beard, Project Manager, Community and Economic Development Department]

> At approximately 11:03 a.m., Pat Beard, Project Manager, Community and Economic Development Department, introduced Norm Gollub, Executive Director, Foss Waterway Development Authority (FWDA). Mr. Gollub presented on the Proposed Upland Site Development of The Village at Foss Harbor, including the existing development area, ownership of the parcels within the development area, development plans for each of the lots, possible designs for buildings going up on the lots, and how the FWDA Board is moving forward.

Discussion ensued regarding the groundbreaking and opening of the Melanie Dressel Park. Discussion concluded on the length of the project and the work that could be done to help speed up the development.
