Call To Order

Chair Ushka called the meeting to order at 4:42 p.m.

Briefing Items

1. 21-0373

Strategic Alliance to Strengthen Family Violence Prevention Services Update [Linda Stewart, Director, Neighborhood and Community Services; Heather Moss, Director of Human Services, Pierce County]

At approximately 4:43 p.m., Linda Stewart, Director, Neighborhood and Community Services (NCS), introduced Heather Moss, Director of Human Services, and Paulina Kura, Special Advisor to the Director of Human Services, Pierce County; and Vicky McLaurin, Community Services Manager, NCS; and provided opening remarks. Ms. Moss presented the strategic alliance to end family violence update, including an introduction to the City of Tacoma and Pierce County partnership and commitment, intended outcomes of the partnership, and steps taken to accomplish goals. Ms. Stewart outlined the data and reports collected to assess efficiency and effective use of limited resources; survey information; recommendations, noting providers and funding agencies; and City of Tacoma domestic violence (DV) services and funding.

Discussion ensued regarding appreciation for the collaboration and work accomplished, policies to ensure the work is continued over time, making DV prevention a City Council priority, the name change from DV to family

violence, the importance of focusing on DV, ensuring resources and staffing are adequate for DV work, building digital infrastructure, measuring when DV work is completed, DV rates, receiving an annual update on trends, and funding for DV services.

21-0374 Body Worn Camera Update and Future Project Prioritization
 [Matt Janzow, Continuous Improvement Analyst, Human Resources; Fred Scruggs, Assistant Chief, and Christopher Travis, Captain, Tacoma Police Department]

At approximately 5:10 p.m., Matt Janzow, Continuous Improvement Analyst, Human Resources, introduced Christopher Travis, Captain, and Fred Scruggs, Assistant Chief, Tacoma Police Department, and presented the body worn camera (BWC) update, including an overview; background; current state of the project; and expansion considerations, noting three potential options. Captain Travis outlined the option to expand BWC to non-patrol commissioned officers, noting benefits, additional support, and costs; the option to expand BWC to dash cameras; and camera footage examples. Mr. Janzow concluded by summarizing the expansion considerations and staff recommendations.

Discussion ensued regarding the expansion options, the current policy related to when the cameras are turned on and off, the benefits of non-patrol commissioned officers having BWC, the assignment of BWC to officers, the impact of BWC on digital records requests, how many dash cameras would be needed, the challenges of taking cameras home and downloading BWC footage, gaps due to the expeditious implementation of the BWC program, timeline and costs of expansion, and lessons learned since the implementation of BWC.
