Community Vitality and Safety Committee

Deputy Mayor Ushka, Chair of the Community Vitality and Safety Committee, reported that the October 13, 2022, meeting was cancelled; and concluded by stating the next meeting will be held in a hybrid format on October 27, 2022, at 4:30 p.m., and will include presentations on anti-displacement strategy priority setting and the Landlord-Tenant Program.

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Council Member Rumbaugh addressed anti-semitic comments made by the entertainment industry and by politicians around the country, stating that when everyone stays quiet on these issues, antisemitism continues to happen and that is unacceptable.

Mayor Woodards congratulated Graduate Tacoma, which held their State of Public Education today, noting she had the opportunity to start the event off with walking in with a three year old and another person who has gone through the whole system and now owns a business in Tacoma; and concluded by stating she had the opportunity today to meet two additional children ages three and seven.
