RESOLUTION NO. 41824

BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS AND COUNCIL MEMBER WALKER

A RESOLUTION conferring the honorary street name "Curtis E. Montgomery Street" for South "G" Street between South 19th Street and South 21st Street.

WHEREAS the Mayor's Office, on behalf of the Public Works Department, is facilitating an honorary street naming request submitted by Greater Christ Temple Church and the family of Bishop Curtis E. Montgomery on October 22, 2025, and

WHEREAS in accordance with Resolution No. 41009, which is related to the City's Policy on Place Names and Name Changes, honorary street naming requests for roadways are to be reviewed as follows:

- (1) By an ad hoc work group consisting of representatives from designated City Departments which determines if the City's naming criteria has been met and makes a recommendation in support of or against the naming application (Section 3, Subsection 4.b.ii);
- (2) At the work group's recommendation as shared with the City Attorney's Office for legal review (Section 3, Subsection 4.b.iii); and
- (3)The naming request is typically presented to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee and the Committee makes a recommendation and forwards the request to Council for further consideration (Section 3, Subsection 4.c.i.-iii.), and



WHEREAS the request for honorary street naming of South "G" Street as "Curtis E. Montgomery Street" has been reviewed by the entities designated in Resolution No. 41009, and these departments have confirmed the application meets the City's naming criteria, and have given recommendations in support of the naming application, and

WHEREAS if adopted, two two-sided honorary street name signs—with a brown background color as expected for street naming of this type—will be added to existing street signs at the corners of South 19th Street and South "G" Street and South "G" street, along with an official two-sided South "G" Street name sign with the customary green background, and

WHEREAS Resolution No. 41009 recommends the City Council consider a number of criteria when evaluating naming proposals, including historical significance, civil service, and equity, inclusion, and reconciliation, and

WHEREAS throughout his ministry and community work, Bishop Curtis E. Montgomery embodied the City's values of equity, inclusion, and reconciliation, and he welcomed and served people from all walks of life, fostering unity during times of deep social division and working to bridge generational, racial, and economic gaps, and

WHEREAS through his advocacy, support for social work education, and the inclusive programming at both Greater Christ Temple Church and the Oasis of Hope Center, Bishop Montgomery advanced opportunities for marginalized

communities and helped create spaces where healing, belonging, and shared purpose could take root, and

WHEREAS Bishop Montgomery demonstrated exemplary civil service leadership through decades of hands-on support to families, youth, and vulnerable community members, and his vision and persistence brought the Oasis of Hope Center to life, one of the Hilltop's most significant privately funded community facilities, which continues to offer essential services, childcare, and programs that strengthen families today, and

WHEREAS Bishop Montgomery's leadership was further honored by the University of Washington Tacoma through the establishment of a scholarship fund in his name, reflecting the lasting impact of his mentorship and commitment to developing future community leaders, and

WHEREAS Bishop Montgomery's nearly five decades of spiritual leadership and community stewardship on the City's Hilltop establish him as a figure of enduring historical importance, and as one of the City's great spiritual titans, he played a stabilizing and unifying role during pivotal eras from the civil rights movement of the 1960s to the gang and drug crises of the 1980s providing guidance, advocacy, and hope to thousands, and

WHEREAS Bishop Montgomery's legacy is woven into the City's history through the institutions he built, the lives he transformed, and the recognition he received as one of the City's historic treasures; Now, Therefore,



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the Council of the City of Tacoma hereby confers the honorary street
