

RESOLUTION NO. 41814

BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS

A RESOLUTION expressing support for the passage of Proposition No. 1, Replacement of Expiring Levy for K-12 Educational Programs and Operations; and Proposition No. 2, Replacement of Expiring Levy for K-12 Technology Improvements and Upgrades, submitted by Tacoma Public School District No. 10, to be considered at the February 10, 2026, Special Election ballot.

WHEREAS the purpose of this resolution is to formally express the City's strong support for the Tacoma School District No. 10 ("District") renewal of two expiring levies that are essential to ensuring high-quality, equitable, and safe educational opportunities for all students, and

WHEREAS these levies supporting educational programs and operations, and technology improvements and upgrades represent foundational investments in the day-to-day functioning of neighborhood schools across the District, and

WHEREAS this support is grounded in the City's longstanding commitment to supporting environments where every child, regardless of race, background, or economic circumstance, can learn, grow, and succeed, and the levies help close persistent opportunity gaps for students of color and students from families experiencing poverty by funding the educators, instructional supports, programs, and tools necessary for student success, and

WHEREAS the levies also ensure access to critical programs ranging from early learning and after-school enrichment to arts, music, athletics, and career and technical education, and all programs that improve academic outcomes and expand pathways to college, careers, and economic mobility, and



WHEREAS the levies further provide for essential safety, maintenance, and technology investments that allow students to learn in secure, well-maintained facilities and to benefit from modern instructional tools in the classroom and at home, up-to-date security systems, and technology-enabled learning environments, and

WHEREAS these investments strengthen building longevity, protect student and staff safety, and support transparent communication and academic tracking among students, families, and educators, and

WHEREAS by bringing forward this resolution, the City affirms the public value of these levies, recognizes their role in sustaining approximately 17 percent of the District's day-to-day operations for teachers, books, and basics in every neighborhood school, as well as nurses, counselors, librarians, and paraeducators – the equivalent of nearly 500 teachers and staff, and underscores the importance of a strong, well-resourced public school system to the long-term health and resilience of the community, and

WHEREAS, our young people are among our community's most important constituents, and supporting the District's propositions is a vital investment in their safety, well-being, and future success, ensuring they have the strong educational foundation needed to thrive and continue contributing to the future of our city, and

WHEREAS according to the state Public Disclosure Commission,
RCW 42.17A.555 allows elected boards, councils, and commissions to "express
a collective decision, or to actually vote upon a motion, proposal, resolution,



order, or ordinance, or to support or oppose a ballot proposition so long as

(a) any required notice of the meeting includes the title and number of the ballot proposition, and (b) members of the legislative body, members of the board, council, or commission of the special purpose district, or members of the public are afforded an approximately equal opportunity for the expression of an opposing view; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City Council endorses and hereby expresses its support for the passage of Proposition No. 1, and Proposition No. 2, submitted by Tacoma School District No. 10, at the February 10, 2025, Special Election, for the purposes hereinabove enumerated.



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Section 2. That the City Council urges Tacoma voters to vote "Approved" on Proposition No. 1 and Proposition No. 2 on the February 10, 2025, Special Election ballot, substantially in the form of the ballot title as follows:

REPLACEMENT OF EXPIRING LEVY FOR K-12 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATIONS

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Tacoma School District No. 10, Pierce County, Washington, providing for the submission to the voters of the District at a special election to be held on February 10, 2026, of a proposition authorizing an excess tax levy to be made annually for four years commencing in 2026 for collection in 2027 of \$127,096,457, in 2027 for collection in 2028 of \$132,180,315, in 2028 for collection in 2029 of \$137,467,528, and in 2029 for collection in 2030 of \$142,966,229 for the District's General Fund to fund educational programs and operations; designating the District's Chief Financial Officer and special counsel to receive notice of the ballot title from the Auditor of Pierce County, Washington; and providing for related matters.

REPLACEMENT OF EXPIRING LEVY FOR K-12 TECHNOLOGY IMPROVEMENTS AND UPGRADES

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Tacoma School District No. 10, Pierce County, Washington, providing for the submission to the voters of the District at a special election to be held on February 10, 2026, of a proposition authorizing an excess tax levy to be made annually for four years commencing in 2026 for collection in 2027 through 2030 in the aggregate total amount of \$170,000,000, for the District's Capital Projects Fund to support the modernization and remodeling of school facilities; designating the District's Chief Financial Officer and special counsel to receive notice of the ballot title from the Auditor of Pierce County, Washington; and providing for related matters.
