# **ITEMS OF INTEREST**

1. Planning and Development Services Director Peter Huffman reports that the City of Tacoma's Comprehensive Plan, One Tacoma, has been certified by the Puget Sound Regional Council for conformance with the Growth Management Act and VISION 2050 multicounty planning policies. This certification ensures the City's ongoing eligibility for transportation funding through the Regional Transportation Improvement Program. The One Tacoma Plan was adopted by the City Council in June of this year.

The One Tacoma Plan identifies goals, policies, and actions for maintaining the health, welfare, and quality of life of Tacoma's residents, including chapters that address neighborhood completeness, environment and watershed health, parks and recreation, housing, economic development, and transportation and infrastructure. Planning and Development Services staff want to acknowledge all of the departments, agencies, and community partners that contributed to this successful update, including Public Works, Environmental Services, Community and Economic Development, Office of Management and Budget, Office of Strategy, Tacoma Public Utilities, Parks Tacoma, and Tacoma Public Schools. Tacoma's Planning and Development Services and community members came together for a
"Critical Areas Walk and Talk," at the Tacoma Nature Center on October 18, 2025. The City of
Tacoma is updating the Critical Areas Ordinance and want to keep you informed about what
the proposed changes are so that you can provide informed feedback during the process.
Under Washington State Law, all counties and cities in the state must conduct a periodical
review and update their critical areas regulations.

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- Thank you to Valarie Kaur, the author of the Tacoma Reads selected book "See No Stranger, "and everyone who attended Tacoma Reads finale event! The Tacoma Armory was filled with book lovers who gathered to listen to a moderated conversation between Mayor Victoria Woodards and Valarie Kaur, and to honor Mayor Woodards' eight years of partnership with the Tacoma Public Library on the Tacoma Reads program which has inspired reading, sparked thought, and initiated conversations throughout.
- The Tacoma City Council recognized the <a href="EnviroChallenger Program">EnviroChallenger Program</a> for 25 years of inspiring environmental stewardship and sustainability in our community! Launched in 2000 by our Tacoma Environmental Services, the program has grown to include four professional educators reaching students of all ages in classrooms, online, and throughout the community. Over the years, EnviroChallenger has become a trusted resource for teachers, built a robust library of digital education tools, and inspired action projects that extend environmental learning far beyond the classroom.
- The Tacoma City Council joined other local governments to promote community-based dispute resolution by proclaiming October 16, 2025, Community Conflict Resolution Day. The Center for Dialogue and Resolution provides anyone in Tacoma with resources to resolve conflicts between family members, neighbors, tenants and landlords, employers, and more. Their services help reduce court hearings by finding productive resolutions to conflict.
- The Tacoma Fire Department proudly supported **Eloise's Cooking Pot Food Bank** with food donations. Items were collected during this year's TFD Employee Appreciation Luncheon, which featured a friendly competition that added extra excitement. Dear Mayor Woodards,

I would like to congratulate Tacoma on completing the comprehensive plan update and thank you and your staff for working with the Puget Sound Regional Council through the certification process. On September 25, 2025, PSRC's Executive Board acted to certify the Tacoma 2024 Comprehensive Plan. This recognizes that the transportation–related provisions in the comprehensive plan conform to the Growth Management Act and are substantially consistent with multicounty planning policies and the Regional Transportation Plan. Certification makes your jurisdiction eligible to apply for PSRC's federal transportation funding and program funds in the Regional Transportation Improvement Program.

Coordinated planning is a hallmark of the Growth Management Act and <u>VISION 2050</u>, the region's long-range plan. In a growing region, it is essential that jurisdictions work together on shared goals such as mobility, housing affordability, and protecting our environment. The city's plan helps move the region forward in advancing those goals.

PSRC has prepared a <u>certification report</u> that contains a summary of PSRC's review of the Tacoma 2024 Comprehensive Plan. PSRC staff coordinated with city staff in the development of the report. The report describes the scope of the certification review as guided by the <u>Plan Review Manual</u>, summarizes findings from the plan, and identifies areas where future work is needed to further VISION 2050, the Regional Transportation Plan, and the Growth Management Act.

The Public Works Department is pleased to provide the attached update to our capital projects planning document. The purpose of this document is to provide additional information regarding funding, costs, and schedules for active capital projects within Public Works. Updates include changes to project schedules and funding, the addition of new projects, and deletion of projects that are complete. The document lists projects in categories according to work phase with projects in design listed first, followed by projects in advertisement, construction, and closeout. The update also includes Public Works support services for Tacoma Rail projects, Neighborhood and Community Services projects, Community and Economic Development projects, and others.

This project list is a result of the residents of Tacoma approving the Street Initiatives (Proposition No. 3 and Transportation Benefit District Proposition A) in November 2015 to fund additional maintenance and improvements to transportation infrastructure. The project funding sources include Propositions A and No. 3, other City funds, grants, gas tax, and City utility funds. Several of the projects are currently funded for design only with construction funding sources to be determined.

Please note this is a planning document that is subject to change as new funding becomes available and as progress is made on capital projects, whether it be in design and/or construction. 


