**SUMMARY:**

Appointing and reappointing the following individuals to the Landmarks Preservation Commission:

- Appointing Maddie Levesque to the “Professional 1” position to fill an unexpired term, to expire December 31, 2028.
- Reappointing Anahita Modrek to the “Architect 2” position to serve a three-year term, retroactive to January 1, 2026, to expire December 31, 2028.
- Reappointing Sarah Hilsendeger to the “At-Large 4” position to serve a three-year term, retroactive to January 1, 2026, to expire December 31, 2028.
