3	A RESOLUTION relating to law enforcement priorities; declaring the investigation, arrest, and prosecution of anyone engaging in entheogen-related activities		
4	to be among the City's lowest law enforcement priorities and stating the City Council's support for full decriminalization of these activities.

6	WHEREAS entheogen is a term that encompasses any living, fresh, dried,		
7	or processed plant or fungal material, including teas or powders, that may contain		
8	currently scheduled or analog psychoactive indolamines, tryptamines, or		
9 10	phenethylamines, including, but not limited to, psilocybin mushrooms, ayahuasca		
11	tea, mescaline, and iboga, and		
12	WHEREAS a variety of jurisdictions in the United States, including Seattle,		
13	Port Townsend, Olympia, and Jefferson County, have supported decriminalization		
14	of entheogens, and Colorado, Oregon, and Washington D.C. have decriminalized		
15	some or all entheogens through successful ballot initiatives, and		
16 17	WHEREAS depression, severe anxiety, problematic substance use,		
18	post-traumatic stress, end-of-life anxiety, grief, isolation, intergenerational trauma,		
19	and other physical and mental conditions are plaguing many communities, and		
20	scientific and clinical studies have shown the benefits of entheogens in treating		
21	these conditions, and		
22 23	WHEREAS clinical trials sanctioned by the United States Food and Drug		
24	Administration ("FDA") show positive results that demonstrate the safety and		
25	efficacy of psilocybin-assisted therapy, and the FDA designated psilocybin-assisted

therapy as a breakthrough therapy for treatment resistant depression in 2018, and
major depressive disorder in 2019, and

WHEREAS cultures around the world recognize entheogens as sacred, and have used them as part of their cultural, spiritual, and religious practices for generations, and

WHEREAS communities face an unprecedented mental health crisis,
unprecedented suicide rates, especially among veterans and marginalized groups,
and a deepening opioid addiction crisis, and the City can contribute to removing
stigmas through public education and supporting community mental health efforts,
and

WHEREAS decriminalization of entheogens does not undermine the
seriousness of the opioid epidemic and impact of harmful substances on the lives
of individuals, families, and communities, and

WHEREAS our 2025 state legislative agenda includes a policy position regarding 'Psilocybin Substances,' and the City encourages the legislature to consider decriminalizing psilocybin substances in light of the growing research indicating potential medical uses for the substances, and the number of local jurisdictions and states that are decriminalizing the substance; Now, Therefore,

2	1. That the City Council hereby declares and establishes the following as			
3 4	its policy:			
5	(1) That the investigation, arrest, and prosecution of anyone engaging in			
6	entheogen-related activities, including, but not limited to the planting, cultivating,			
7	gathering, transporting, distributing, possession, or using entheogens by adults,			
8	should be among the City's lowest law enforcement priorities;			
9	(2) This resolution does not:			
10 11	(a) Permit driving under the influence of entheogenic plants or			
12	fungi;			
13	(b) Permit the possession or distribution of entheogens in schools			
14	or parks;			
15 16	(c) Authorize or enable commercial manufacturing or sales of			
17	entheogenic plants or fungi;			
18	(d) Permit conduct that puts public safety at risk or causes a			
19	public nuisance that violates the law; or			
20	(e) Prohibit or discourage the investigation, arrest, or prosecution			
21	of crimes in sections (a)-(d); and			
22 23	(3) The City Council states its support for continued research for			
24	alternative treatment modalities, as well as our support for structured medical			
25	models, and the City Council further states its support for the full decriminalization			
²⁶ of entheogen-related activities at the federal level.
